In April 2013, I appointed a Range Rider 2014 Advisory Committee to celebrate 40 years of the Range Rider Program and to enhance its value to ICMA members and to state associations in the second century of ICMA. The Range Rider Program, now in 22 states, has been a valued service and is an important partnership between ICMA and state associations.

The Advisory Committee was composed of key stakeholders: Range Riders, state secretariats and state leaders from the states with programs, and other members served by the program, such as former MITs and first time administrators in those states. The Committee engaged Range Riders and state

sponsors in the development of the recommendations. The Committee's recommendations to
